## "A Concert Sell Out?" *You Decide!*

In December 2007 we achieved our first and only "Sold House." Club members sold 600 tickets before sales were turned over to the box office. The box office sold 117 tickets and comp tickets made up the rest of the distribution (comp tickets were given to all of our advertisers as well as several community leaders - no advertisers this year until the spring program). As we go to press 416 tickets have been purchased by club members. That gives us a goal of 84 tickets to be purchased today and then 100 more next Tuesday to match last year's member sales of 600. We have just 84 tickets on hand today. But next week can we sell 100 tickets? 150? You know how exciting it was last year to see that sign go up on the box office "Sold Out!" Let's do it again!

## A World of Music
