H. Douglas Custance, Music Director



The announcement in May 2003 that H. Douglas Custance had accepted the position as Conductor of the Leisure World Chorale began four exciting and happy years in the recent life of the Chorale. Mr. Custance, well known in the world of music, has an impressive resume of appearances throughout the United States and Europe both as a soloist and as a conductor.

Now in his 27th year as a Saddleback College Emeritus Institute adjunct professor of music, Mr. Custance leads several musical groups in addition to the Village Chorale and teaches a successful voice class. In addition to his teaching, Maestro Custance continues a successful career as choral conductor, soloist and clinician. He has conducted such diverse groups as the Los Angeles Mozart Orchestra and the Boston Pops. For more than ten years, he was the music director and conductor of the

southern California Mormon Choir in Los Angeles. He has performed at the Hollywood Bowl, Dorothy Chandler Pavilion, Orange County Center for the Performing Arts, Carnegie Hall, and the Sistine Chapel in Vatican City. He has sung Handel's Messiah in Moscow and St. Petersburg.

Mr. Custance lives in Laguna Hills with his wife, Linda and their son, Nathan. The Custances have five children, eleven grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Juanita Tsu, Accompanist

Juanita Tsu has brought a wealth of talent and expertise to the Leisure World Chorale ever since she accepted the position of Chorale Accompanist in 2002.

She has performed extensively on stage, radio, and television as a recital soloist, as soloist with various orchestras and chamber music groups, and as accompanist for a wide range of instrumentalists and vocalists.

At the age of seven and a half, Ms. Tsu started playing the piano and at 15 she entered the National Academy of Arts in Taiwan as a piano performance major. She earned her Bachelor of Music degree in Baltimore, Maryland at the Peabody Conservatory of Music. She earned a Master of Music Degree at the New England Conservatory in Boston, Massachusetts.

Ms. Tsu served as a faculty member at the University of Massachusetts, Lowell from 1977 to 2000 where she was coordinator of the piano program.

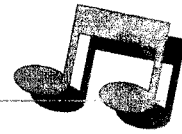
Ms. Tsu opened her Southern California Piano Studio after moving to the Laguna Woods Village in July, 2000. In addition to accompanying the Chorale, she serves as Choir Director for the Reform Temple of the Village, accompanies the Mission Viejo High School Choirs, and accompanies the Seventh Day Adventist Church Choir of Garden Grove.
