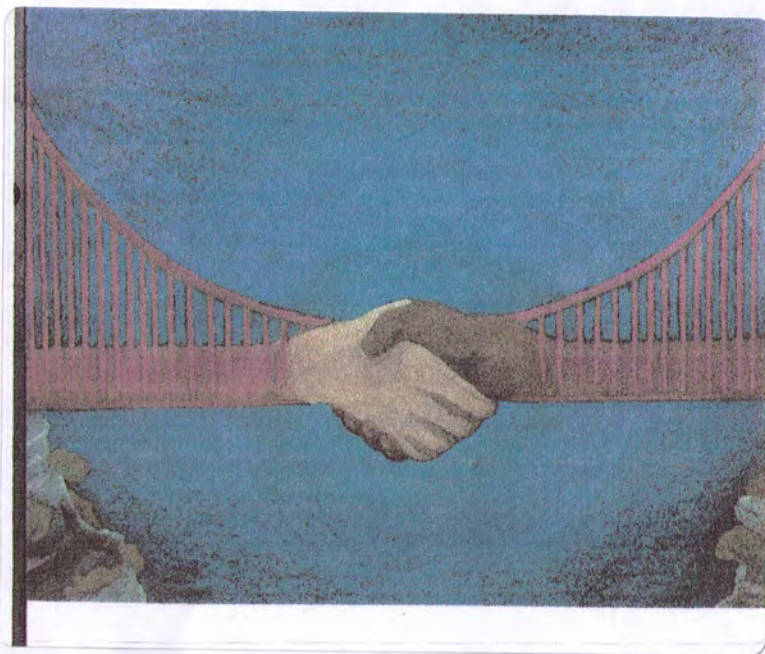

Tung-Hsin Choral Society, in Brief



The groundbreaking founding of Tung-Hsin Choral Society in the July of 1979 by Lucy Lee Lin and Ling Tang in the nation's capital region has engendered a significant surge of enthusiasm in choral music among the Chinese-American communities. In thirty-two years there are today some twenty sister choruses in existence, with annual "choral fest" since 1987. Tung-Hsin literally means "young at heart," but it connotes even more closely to "pure at heart," an ideal that symbolizes purity and vitality which the members hold dear. Over the decades the group has performed on twelve and one hundred occasions at such venues as the Kennedy Center, the National Theater, the Museum of American History, the Lincoln Center, Sidney Kimmel Cancer Center and television programs. Concert tours include such places as Boston, Ottawa, New York, Seattle, Taiwan, Quemoy and Hong Kong. The society currently consists of forty-six active chorus members, thirty-one are present in this joint concert with the Laguna Woods Village Chorale.
